A brief history

•	1199	Cistercian monks establish the monastery of Hilda on the southern bank of the mouth of the river Ryck, near rich salt deposits. Since the 14th century, this monastery has been known as Eldena
	1248	First documentary mention of the 'oppidum Gripheswald' among the monastery's landholdings
	1250	Granting of the Lübeck law, market settlement thus gains town status
	1278	Greifswald becomes a member of the Hanseatic League
	1456	Opening of Greifswald University, the second oldest in northern Europe, initiated by mayor Heinrich Rubenow
	1648	In the Peace of Westphalia, Greifswald falls along with Western Pomerania to Sweden
	1774	Caspar David Friedrich, the most important painter of German Romanticism, is born in Greifswald
	1815	Transfer of Swedish Pomerania, and thus Greifswald, to Prussia
	1945	30 April – surrender of the undestroyed city to the Soviet army without a fight
	2000	Opening of the Picture Gallery at the Pomeranian State Museum



Greifswald acquires the designation of University and Hanseatic City
 100th anniversary of the Friedrich-Loeffler-Institut, Federal Research Institute for Animal Health on the island of Riems
 Loss of the city's county status
 28 April – after five years of construction, the Greifswald flood barrier enters into operation as part of the storm tide protection system.

The city's oldest buildings include the ruins of the Eldena monastery and its three large parish churches. Construction of the city began in the 13th century and continued over many years. The gabled house at Markt 13 is considered the city's oldest house. It was built around 1290 as the home of a Hanseatic merchant. The Fangenturm was built as part of the city fortifications (defensive structure) in 1270/80.







World-class research

• Friedrich-Loeffler-Institut (FLI)

The Federal Research Institute for Animal Health operates from seven locations across Germany and has its head-quarters on the island of Riems, a district of the University and Hanseatic City of Greifswald. The objectives of its work are to protect against infections, epizootics and infectious diseases transmissible from animals to humans. Around 420 staff currently work at the site.

Max Planck Institute for Plasma Physics (IPP)

The aim of fusion research at the IPP is to develop a climate and environmentally-friendly power plant. The energy is to be generated, as in the sun, from the fusion of atomic nuclei. Scientists, engineers and tradespeople from all four corners of the globe have built the Wendelstein 7-X fusion research facility in Greifswald to this end. It is the largest fusion plant of its type in the world, designed to investigate the suitability of the construction as a power plant.

Leibniz Institute for Plasma Research and Technology (INP)

At INP, the largest non-university research institute for low-temperature plasmas in Europe, more than 200 staff are currently conducting research on physical plasmas. The technology is used, among other things, for coating surfaces, decontaminating air and liquids, sterilising food and in the medical sector and electrical engineering.

Alfried Krupp Wissenschaftskolleg Greifswald

The institute's academic programme focuses on inviting academics for research visits to Greifswald within the framework of the Alfried Krupp Fellows Programme, organising academic lectures, conferences, symposia and summer schools and developing young scientists.



WITENO GmbH

WITENO GmbH is a joint subsidiary of the City of Greifswald, the University of Greifswald and Sparkasse Vorpommern. As an interface between science and business, it offers advice, coaching and space. The focus is on biotech, bioeconomy, IT, medical technology, pharmaceuticals, the environment and energy and plasma technology. The location has the highest density of researchers in plasma technology and life sciences in the whole of Europe. The Centre for Life Science and Plasma Technology (Z4) will open next to the BioTechnikum in 2023, combining research, development and production under one roof. Both centres are perfectly integrated into the infrastructure of the university campus and offer the ideal environment for companies set to grow.

• Center for Community Medicine

Another highlight on the university campus will be the Center for Community Medicine. In future, it will be used to research diseases such as diabetes, obesity and cardiovascular illnesses and their increasing incidence in connection with demographic change in the population. The construction of this interdisciplinary centre for population-related health research will create jobs for about 380 employees with an area of over 7,000 m².
