# Small town chronicle

	1199	Cistercian monks found the Hilda monastery, which has been called Eldena since the 14th century, on the southern bank of the Ryck estuary, close to rich salt deposits
•	1248	First documentary mention of the "oppidum Gripheswald" among the possessions of the monastery
	1250	Granting of Lübish law and thus elevation of the market settlement to town status
•	1278	Greifswald becomes a member of the Hanseatic League
•	1456	Opening of Greifswald University, the second oldest in Northern Europe, initiated by the mayor Heinrich Rubenow
	1648	Greifswald and Western Pomerania fall to Sweden in the Peace of Westphalia
	1774	Caspar David Friedrich, the most important painter of German Romanticism, is born in Born in Greifswald
	1815	Transfer of Swedish Pomerania and thus also Greifswald to Prussia
•	1945	30 April - surrender without a fight of the undestroyed city to the Soviet army
•	2000	Opening of the Picture Gallery of the Pomeranian State Museum

# Greifswald location

Among the oldest buildings in the town are the ruins of the Eldena monastery and the three large town churches. Their construction began in 13th century and over long periods of time. The gabled house (Markt 13) is considered to be the oldest building in the town. It was built around 1290 as a Hanseatic merchant's house. The Fangenturm as part of the town fortifications (defence structure) was built in 1270/80.

Greifswald University Medicine has its origins in the founding of the university on 17 October 1456, which also saw the establishment of the Faculty of Medicine. Today, Greifswald University Medicine covers a wide range of services in which clinics/ polyclinics, institutes and other central facilities work together. The facilities are grouped together on the Beitz-Platz campus. This enables an efficient infrastructure. Innovative, interdisciplinary work is lived practice here.



# World-class research

#### • Friedrich-Loeffler-Institute (FLI)

The Federal Research Institute for Animal Health is an independent higher federal authority within the portfolio of the Federal Ministry of Food and Agriculture. The work of the FLI focuses on the health and welfare of farm animals and the protection of humans from zoonoses, i.e. infections that can be transmitted between animals and humans. Around 850 employees currently work in twelve specialised institutes at five locations throughout Germany. The head office is located on the island of Riems, which belongs to Greifswald.

#### Max Planck Institute for Plasma Physics (IPP)

The Wendelstein 7-X experimental facility at the IPP sub-institute in Greifswald is intended to demonstrate the suitability of stellarator-type fusion for power plants. The aim of fusion research is to develop a climate and environmentally friendly power plant. Similar to the sun, it will generate energy from the fusion of atomic nuclei. With around 1,100 employees, 320 of whom are based in Greifswald, the IPP is one of the largest centres for fusion research in Europe.

 Leibniz Institute for Plasma Science and Technology e.V. (INP) The Leibniz Institute for Plasma Science and Technology has been conducting applied basic research and development in the field of low-temperature plasmas for over 25 years under the motto "From idea to prototype". More than 200 employees work at the INP, the largest non-university research facility for low-temperature plasmas in Europe. This technology is used, among other things, for coating surfaces, decontaminating air and liquids, sterilising food, well as in medical and electrical engineering.



#### Center for Community Medicine

Centre "Willam B. Kannil Center for Community Medicine" (CM) research building is currently under construction on the university campus. The federal government and the state of Mecklenburg-Vorpommern are jointly investing around 65.7 million euros here. In future, around 380 employees will be researching diseases such as diabetes, obesity and cardiovascular diseases and their increasing incidence in connection with demographic change in the population.

#### • WITENO GmbH

WITENO GmbH is a subsidiary of the City of Greifswald, the University of Greifswald and Sparkasse Vorpommern. As an interface between science and business, it comprehensive advice, coaching and attractive space. Europe's most innovative mile for plasma technology and life sciences runs directly along the university campus, where the BioTechnikum and Z4 are located. The focus is on the areas of biotechnology, bioeconomy, IT, medical technology, pharmaceuticals, environment, energy and plasma technology. With the opening of Z4 in 2023, WITENO will unite research, development and production under one roof. The centers are optimally integrated into the campus infrastructure and offer an excellent environment for growth-oriented companies.
